














STUDENT COUNCIL NEWS

INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

With the outbreak of measles in Vancouver, BC, families may be wondering what steps they can take to protect themselves from measles. Vaccination is the best method of protection. All school-age children and adults born in 1970 or later should have 2 doses of MMR vaccine for full protection. Most people born before 1970 are immune to measles because of past exposure or disease. Please take some time to check your vaccination records to see if you or your children need additional vaccination. Vaccination is available from physicians, pharmacists (for adults and children over 5 years), and public health units (for children). Call ahead to your healthcare provider to ensure that MMR is available at your appointment. More information about measles and MMR vaccine can be found at healthlinkbc.ca and immunizebc.ca.

COUGAR AWARENESS

With numerous cougar sightings occurring in Port Alice over the past few weeks, please ensure your children are aware of the recommended behaviour should a cougar be encountered.

IF YOU ENCOUNTER A COUGAR

- Remain calm.
- Don't run.
- Face the cougar. Don't turn your back on the cougar. Stand up.
- Make yourself look bigger raise your hands overhead. If you have a jacket or a backpack hold it up so you look even bigger and bulkier.
- Throw things at the cougar if it's close enough.
- Smile, show the cougar your teeth to the cougar you're displaying weapons.
- Yell, shout and make intimidating noises your goal is to convince the cougar that you are NOT prey, and may in fact be dangerous.

While there are active cougar sightings, we recommend that elementary students should be in groups when playing or walking outside. Extra precautions are being taken at school during recess and lunch including limited play areas and additional supervision.

Our Conservation Officers will actively respond to reported cougar sightings around residential neighbourhoods and schools.

SCIENCE FAIR

The season of the science fair project is about to start. All schools in our district will be holding science fairs at the end of March and beginning of April in preparation for the District Science Fair on April 11. Here's some information to help you get ready.

Students may enter a project in one of three categories, experiment, innovation, or study.

How can parents help?

- ♦ Help your child establish a topic or direction.
- ♦ Give your child moral support
- Supervise your child's project to ensure all experiments are conducted safely.

Try not to give in to temptation

- ◆ Try to let your child construct their model or experiment independently
- ♦ Let your child find the information they need
- ♦ Do not draw diagrams or construct your child's backboard

- ♦ Give your child advice about their project
- ♦ Help your child collect material



Our annual science fairs help students explore and consolidate the scientific method. They foster critical and creative thinking and allow students to showcase their learning to the whole community, which in turn leads to increase communication skills. Please encourage your child to participate in the science fair. Who knows? Maybe the next Stephen Hawking lives on the North Island?

Experiment

This is a classic type of science fair project. An experiment is an investigation that follows the scientific method.

Innovation

This type of science fair project includes developing a device, model or technique that will have human or commercial benefit.

Study

This type of science fair project is an in depth study from the natural, social, biological or health sciences.
