REMINDERS

- O Any parents wishing to volunteer at the school, including riding the bus and joining us on field trips must have a criminal record check completed and on file with the school. CRC's need to include a vulnerable sectors check. There is a letter which we can provide for you to take to the RCMP when requesting your CRC. Please contact the office if you have any questions
- O Hydro outages What to do when the power goes out during a school day? Any decision to close the school has to be made by the Superintendent, and no decision will likely be made in the first half an hour of a power failure Please wait for half an hour before contacting the school, as we are busy trying to re lay and receive information when an event first happens. Just a reminder if the power goes out BEFORE school, and you can be at home or make arrangements for your children, please do. Although staff (if at all possible) will be at school for those children who may have no other place to go, the building will be dark and cold.
- O Reminder to tuck an extra pair of socks into your child's backpack for those cold, rainy days ahead.
