Each weekly session takes place between 11-1 on Fridays (ranging from 1 to 1.5 hours in length) and usually runs for 3-4 sessions. All volunteers are required to submit a Criminal Record Check before beginning to work with students. Family & community members can also volunteer as helpers, rather than leaders. (Criminal Record Check consent forms are available at the school office.)

Of course, October also means Halloween. Please remember that Halloween at school focuses on the bright side of the celebration, not the dark. If you are not sure if your costume is appropriate for school, it probably isn't; please do not bring gory masks, costumes or props. As at other times, toy weapons are also not allowed.
